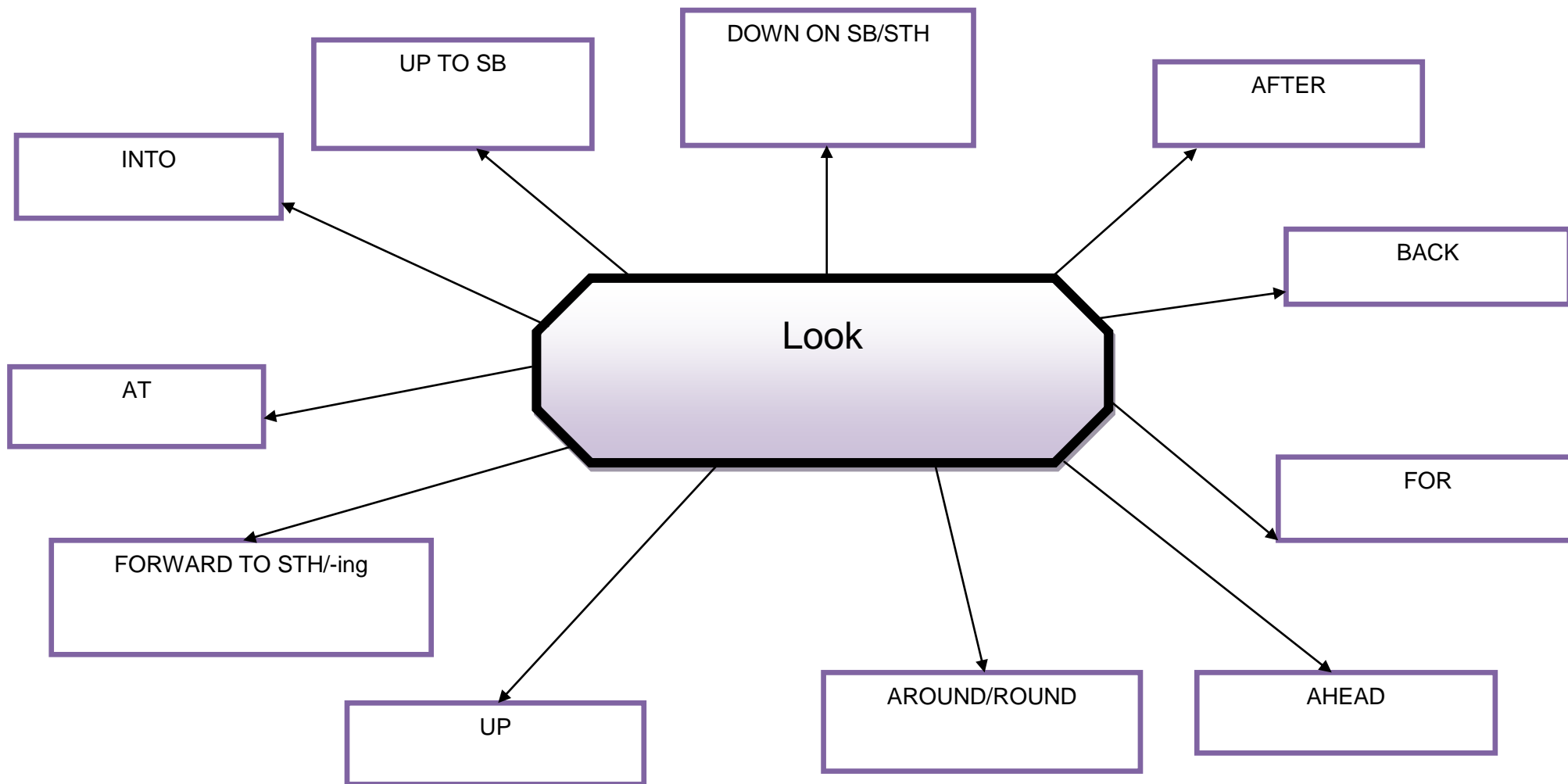


# PHRASAL VERBS: LOOK



## PHRASAL VERBS: LOOK

### LOOK

- **Look into:** Investigate.
- **Look up to sb:** Admire.
- **Look down on sb/sth:** Think that someone or something is less important than you.
- **Look back:** To think about the past.
- **Look around:** To search.
- **Look after:** To take care of.
- **Look for:** Try to find something or someone.
- **Look forward for sth/-ing:** to anticipate something with pleasure.
- **Look ahead:** To think about the future.
- **Look at:** Contemplate/Consider.
- **Look up:** Consult a reference book.
